motoring writer Janek Zdzarski frequently covers rallies outside Eastern Europe, ran a championship in 1974 to find the best Polish rally driver. Results were based on finishing records, home and international events were taken into account, with points scored being multiplied by a co-efficient according to the importance and the status of the event. The events were those in the Polish, Socialist Country, European and World Championships, and it was possible to score half a point for just finishing. The total number of points scorers was 210, and the winners were Maciej Stawowiak and Jan Czyzyk. Second place was shared by Blazej and Jerzy Landsberg, and third by Lelio Lattari and Marek Szramowski.
